MAKING PROGRESS TOWARDS ENDING HOMELESSNESS AND VIOLENCE IN OUR COMMUNITY

A Note from Ben Brustkern, Executive Director

When I am out in the community people always ask what is new at Friends of the Family. I appreciate that you recognize we are always in a growth mindset. You know Friends of the Family is here to make progress towards ending homelessness and violence in our community. The challenge is real, but if you have ever met our staff you know they are up to that challenge.



- Coordinated Entry for homeless services: This addition to the agency leads us closer to ending homelessness in NE lowa. Making sure that we prioritize the most vulnerable people and get them housed quickly is the key to ending homelessness. Friends of the Family will lead this effort in partnership with other agencies locally.
- Male Engagement in Prevention: We have been shifting our violence prevention
 efforts towards engaging males. We have created a partnership with Allen
 Women's Health to provide the Wise Guys curriculum with middle and high
 school boys. This summer the curriculum is being completed at the Boys and
 Girls Club of the Cedar Valley. We look forward to bringing it into more school
 districts this fall.
- Expansion of Turning Point Rural Housing Program: Turning Point is a rapid rehousing program for homeless families and individuals and has always ranked as one of the top 5 homeless programs in the state. This year we were awarded funds to expand on this program and serve more people. This is great news for our community.
- Human Trafficking programming expanded: We are in the process of adding a part time individual to our human trafficking program which will allow us to expand the capacity of the program and ensure communities are becoming educated on this subject. We are grateful for this opportunity to serve more survivors.

Your belief and support in Friends of the Family allows us to continue expanding services for survivors of violence and homelessness. Without you we would not be who we are today. I promise that we will continue to make you proud to be a supporter of Friends of the Family.

YOU ARE NEVER TOO YOUNG TO GET INVOLVED


