

VISION: EVERYONE HAS A HOME!

Take a moment, close your eyes, and imagine that we are in the year 2030 and what life might look like. As you come back, start to picture what it would look like if people's experiences with homelessness were brief and solved quickly. That we no longer have people waiting for services, and that EVERYONE is quickly moved into stable housing that helps lay the foundation for so many life successes.

Everyday we work to create new permanent housing opportunities through grant applications, donations, and quality case management. Last year, we provided 201 permanent housing options and in 2021, the goal is 217 options. More permanent housing options means less people experiencing homelessness.

We also talk about decreasing the length of stay in shelter, so that people can move quickly into permanent housing and not experience long shelter stays. This means on day one, we work with clients to create shelter exit plans and look at permanent housing options. We provide top-notch housing counseling services that helps make the average stay in shelter 11.39 days. We want that shortened to 10.98 days by the end of 2021.

We believe that this is attainable, and we strive for the vision every single day. We talk about it as an organization with every person we hire, existing staff, board members, and the communities we serve. We have a big audacious goal, and we will not back down from it. We will put our reputation on the line. And we will be successful in meeting our vision.


