A Note from Ben Brustkern, Executive Director

"New normal" "Can you hear me" "Shelter in place"

This is the new terminology that we have encountered over the past 6 weeks. It will stick with us for the rest of our lives as we remember what it was like to live through COVID-19. However, for those who are living with a person doing harm or are homeless, the risk factors have increased beyond COVID-19.

But we expected this. Being sheltered in place with your abuser creates further isolation and anxiety for a survivor. Imagine the additional questions that now need to be asked. Is it safe to go to an emergency shelter? Does the stay at home order mean I cannot leave my house? Will I be in a shelter longer? Are the programs that provide services still working?

For homeless people living on the street or in a shelter, COVID-19 creates further risk to their health. Campgrounds are being closed and shelters are decreasing capacity to serve people. Housing programs maybe harder to access and hope can dwindle.

At Friends of the Family we continue to provide interventions related to crisis, shelter, and housing. Now it is not the time to decrease access to services, but a time to address issues head on. We must make sure that the folks trying to flee a lethal relationship have a safe place to go, or that the family experiencing homelessness still has access to rapid rehousing. We are increasing our dollars available to provide direct client services to ensure we meet today's needs. What does that mean for client assistance 3 months from now? I don't know.

What I do know, is that **we will continue to work hard for this** great community. I hope you consider donating to Friends of the Family so we can continue to assist those in need. Your donation helps "Take back tomorrow, today!"
