GOOD THINGS

Nicole, Outreach and Diversion Specialist in Mason City, shared Jeremy's story with us about his transition from homeless to housed and how he is maintaining and staying successful. (Read the full story on page 4)

Office Manager, Monique shared that Grace Fellowship church in Waterloo recently donated 32 bags filled with essentials for those who are experiencing homelessness in the community. These will be used for clients we work with and our street outreach program.

Ashley, our Safely Home Housing Support Specialist, shared about a client in the Safely Home housing program who left a domestic violence situation. The client worked hard, got a job, and worked their way up to an assistant manager position. They started making enough money to support themselves and their kids and was able to graduate off the program!

DAY OF CARING

This year, Friends of the Family was able to be a part of not one but TWO Day of Caring events, one in Mason City and one in Waverly. Wondering what Day of Caring is? It's an amazing opportunity for local businesses to come together and give back to non-profits in the area as well as provide them with service projects that can be accomplished in a day.

Our first Day of Caring was celebrated in Mason City. Eleven hours were given between five Mason City Target members who put together kits for our street outreach program. These kits are filled with necessities and taken out into the community and given to those who are experiencing homelessness.



Our second Day of Caring was spent in Waverly and was organized by Waverly-Shell Rock Area United Way. Two different organizations spent their time volunteering for Friends of the Family. TruStage Brokerage raised over \$1,600 and spent the day shopping for much needed items for our crime victim shelter. Waverly Nestle gave their time to refinish two picnic tables as well as landscape. And we cannot forget our incredible individual volunteer Bev, who spent time organizing donations and items for us! Collectively, 66.5 hours were donated to Friends of the Family.

The day ended with FOF staff participating in the wrap up celebration. The team raised \$170 in tips during the celebrity bartender face-off and we were given recognition for participating in our FIFTH Day of Caring!

We are so grateful all the people and organizations who gave of their time and treasures to Friends of the Family. It's through this kind of support that we can continue to work in the communities we serve and get closer to our 10 year vision: Everyone Has A Home.

JEREMY'S STORY

One of our Outreach and Diversion Specialists, Nicole, met Jeremy (pictured right*) on a cold night in March. He shared his story with us about his journey from homeless to housed.

While conducting street outreach on a snowy night earlier this year, Nicole met Jeremy in the parking lot of Casey's. He was cold, hungry, tired and struggling with health issues due to diabetes. She explained that she was with Friends of the Family, out in the community doing street outreach and asked if he was interested in doing an assessment or at that very least, if he wanted something to eat and a backpack of supplies.

After agreeing to do an assessment, Nicole found out that Jeremy was a veteran but he didn't believe he would qualify for any vet services and wasn't interested in pursuing them. She left that night but later saw him three more times during outreach. During their third meeting, Nicole was persistent and suggested that they at least try and see if he qualified for any services. She would connect him to Veterans Affairs (VA) as well as help with any paperwork needed.

Jeremy finally made the decision to move forward with Friends of the Family that night and two months after their initial meeting on that cold winter night, he was accepted into VA programming! He started working with a case manager and through work and determination, Jeremy was successfully excited from the homeless system.

Nicole ran into Jeremy several months later at an event. He walked up to her beaming with pride and let her know he has been housed for five months and had everything he had every hoped for. He thanked her excitedly and shared that if they had not met that night during outreach, and had she not continued to check-in with him, he would have probably died on the street.

He also told her he has been sober since the first time they spoke and that he couldn't be happier with his life now. Jeremy continued to thank Nicole and said, "Friends of the Family IS making a



difference for people on the street at their lowest and I could not be more grateful for the work you do."

After this meeting, Nicole followed up with Jeremy one more time. She met his granddaughter, whom he now gets to spend time with and be a caretaker for, now that he is sober, in a stable place and safely housed.
