- Provide trauma-informed care and victim advocacy, crisis counseling, safety planning, and education to survivors of violence
- Assist clients with housing and community resource applications
- Provide Information on available community resources and assist in resource navigation to support attaining and maintaining housing
- Comply with data tracking and documentation requirements
