NEW PROGRAM: ALWAYS HOME

Always Home is a newly funded program for Friends of the Family.

Recently, Friends of the Family received funding from the Development of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Always Home Program. This is a permanent supportive housing (PSH) program provided in Cerro Gordo County. PSH is permanent housing in which housing assistance and supportive services are provided to assist households with at least one member (adult or child) with a disability in achieving housing stability.

Always Home will be provided in Cerro Gordo specifically because the need is so high. Prior to this, a permanent supportive housing program wasn't available in Cerro Gordo and this will be the first in the county.

For a client to qualify for this program, they have to have a documented disability of long duration. It also prioritizes those who have experienced chronic homelessness which is a term used to describe individuals who have experienced homelessness for at least a year — or repeatedly — while struggling with a disabling condition such as a serious mental illness, substance use disorder, or physical disability.

Always Home prioritizes people experiencing category one and four homelessness. This specific program is unique to our other housing programs in the area because an individual can receive assistance for the duration of their need, there's not a time limit for how long someone can receive assistance.

This program is partnering with Prairie Ridge Integrated Behavioral Healthcare in Mason City. Participants in Always Home are able to be referred to Prairie Ridge so they have access to substance use programming if needed.

Friends of the Family began offering this program on January 1st and we have already begun pulling people for this program. There are 12 spots available and if individuals are interested in learning more, they can call our Housing Hotline at 319-233-3094.
